

## Ar ddod cyn hir... Diweddariadau cyffrous i Ddangosfwrdd Iechyd a Lles Plant Ysgol Uwchradd – Data Arolwg y Rhwydwaith

Rydym wrth ein bodd i gyhoeddi y bydd diweddariad i **Ddangosfwrdd Iechyd a Lles Plant Ysgol Uwchradd** yn cael ei ryddhau ar **17 Hydref**. Dyma ddarn o waith cydweithredol rhwng y Rhwydwaith Ymchwil Iechyd mewn Ysgolion ac Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru. Bydd y diweddariad hwn yn cynnig mwy fyth o gipolygon i iechyd a lles plant ysgol uwchradd ar draws Cymru, gan helpu defnyddwyr i ddeall y sefyllfa bresennol yng Nghymru a gallu gwneud penderfyniadau gwybodus sy'n effeithio'n gadarnhaol ar bobl ifanc.

I ddathlu'r lansiad, bydd Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru yn cynnal gweminar ar **17 Hydref** i arddangos y nodweddion sydd wedi'u diweddarau ac arddangos sut i ddefnyddio'r dangosfwrdd ar ei newydd wedd yn fyw. and wider stakeholders, and provides details about the 2024 data collection for primary schools.

The SEQ, used in combination with the biennial SHRN Student Health and well-being survey creates a unique and comprehensive dataset to explore links between school policies and practices (e.g. school leadership; school ethos; school environment; curriculum learning; family and community engagement) and learner health and well-being outcomes.

Both the SHW and the SEQ survey have been identified as key data sources that support schools in embedding a Whole-school Approach to Emotional and Mental Well-being, as well as SEQ data is used by participating schools as an auditing mechanism to prepare for and evidence practice for [Estyn](#) school inspections.'

We are excited to announce that an update to **The Secondary School Children's Health and Well-being Dashboard - SHRN survey data** will be released on **October 17**. This is a collaborative piece of work between The School Health Research Network and Public Health Wales. This update will provide even more insights into the health and well-being of secondary school children across Wales, helping users to understand the current situation in Wales and be able to make informed decisions that positively impact young people.

To celebrate the launch, Public Health Wales will be hosting a **webinar on October 17** to showcase the updated features and provide a live demo on how to navigate the updated dashboard. Be sure to join us to learn how to make the most of this powerful tool by registering using the link below.

The updated dashboard will include several new features:

- **Addition of 2023 secondary school SHRN survey data:** Updated data for topics will be available across the dashboard.
- **New topics and breakdowns available:** A number of new 'well-being and emotional health' topics will be added as well as further breakdowns by year group or by the gender option; "*Neither word describes me*".
- **Improved user experience:** An improvement to the navigation will make it easier to access the information you need quickly, with new visualisations and filters.

This update will make the dashboard an even more useful tool for understanding the factors that impact our young people's well-being by giving us an insight into the most recent secondary school survey data" said Zoe Strawbridge, Advanced Public Health Intelligence Analyst at Public Health Wales.

## **A Wolfson Clinical Spotlight - Increasing access to psychological treatments for child anxiety problems**

Our colleagues in [The Wolfson Centre for Young People's Health](#) recently recorded a webinar focusing on the psychological treatments for anxiety in children.

Anxiety problems are common and often start early in life. However, few families access evidence based support when they could first benefit from it. Following detailed explorations of what families want and need to overcome barriers to support for preadolescent children, Wolfson have recently focused on using therapist-supported digital approaches to help parents and carers to help their children. This webinar will give an overview of some of this background as well as findings from recent trials that highlight the promise of this approach for treatment and prevention.

The webinar is relevant to a range of practitioners interested in young people's mental health and anxiety in particular.

## **Help promote exciting new study that provides mental health support for families**

The [Wolfson Centre for Young People's Mental Health](#) at Cardiff University are looking for help with promoting and advertising an important new study to young people aged 13-19 years, and their parents and carers.

The Skills for Adolescent Well-being (SWELL) Study will test whether a group cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) program, that teaches skills for well-being, can protect young people against low mood and depression. It also offers extra support for the parents'/carers' own mental health.

The study is seeking the support of schools and colleges to get the word out to parents/carers/students who might be eligible and could benefit from this support. This could be via sending letters or texts out to parents/carers or sharing information about the study on a parent information portal.

Families will receive £160 in vouchers for taking part.
