



In response to growing concerns around learner well-being, a cluster of primary and secondary schools based in Monmouthshire led by local WNHWPS coordinator's Emma Taylor and Sally Amos have developed a robust, data-informed approach to improving health and well-being outcomes.

Using a collaborative approach, the cluster has designed and implemented interventions to target key issues such as screen use, online bullying, and

sedentary behaviour. This case study outlines their journey, from analysis to action, and the impact of their efforts.




## Home of SHRN Wins Top Workplace Award!


