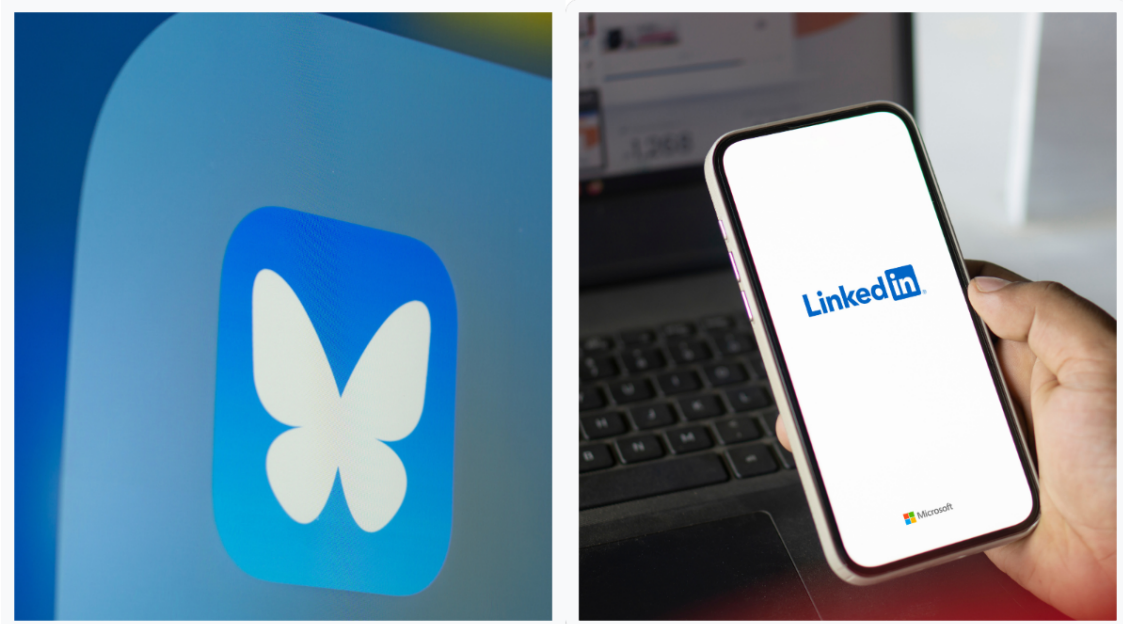

In response to growing concerns around learner well-being, a cluster of primary and secondary schools based in Monmouthshire led by local WNHWPS coordinator's Emma Taylor and Sally Amos have developed a robust, data-informed approach to improving health and well-being outcomes.

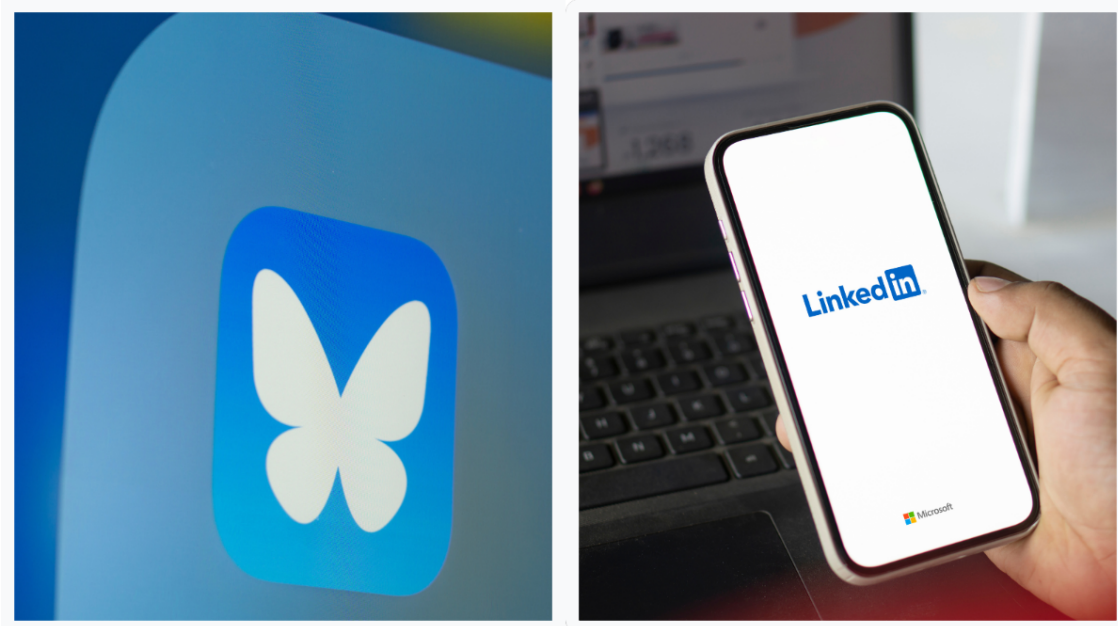


Home Of SHRN Wins Top Workplace Award!
